- Program completion rate– students completing the program within the program’s published time frame. Documentation must include the number and percentage of students completing the program within the published timeframe for each of the three most recently completed academic years. If, when averaged over 3 years, the program’s completion rate does not meet or exceed the Council for Academic Accreditation (CAA’s) established threshold, the program must provide an explanation and a plan for improving the results.
- Praxis examination pass rate– program graduates passing the Praxis examination. Documentation must include the number and percentage of program graduates who pass the Praxis examination for each of the three most recently completed academic years; programs are required to report results only once for graduates who took the exam multiple times in the same reporting period. If, when averaged over 3 years, the program’s graduate pass rate does not meet or exceed the CAA’s established threshold, the program must provide an explanation and a plan for improving the results.
- Employment rate– program graduates employed in the profession or pursuing further education in the profession within 1 year of graduation. Documentation must include the number and percentage of program graduates who are employed as defined above for each of the three most recently completed academic years. If, when averaged over 3 years, the program’s employment rate does not meet or exceed the CAA’s established threshold, the program must provide an explanation and a plan for improving the results.
