The "RDH" Designation

The RDH credential identifies a dental hygienist as a licensed oral health professional. State licensure requirements typically require that a dental hygienist must graduate from a nationally accredited dental hygiene education program, successfully pass a national written examination, and a state or regional clinical examination.
