

What is a General Practice Residency?

- A General Practice Residency (GPR) "is designed for advanced clinical and didactic training in general dentistry with intensive hospital experience at the postdoctoral level." * (ADA website)
- The UAMS GPR provides advanced didactic training and clinical experience in endodontics, periodontics, prosthodontics, implantology, pediatrics, and oral surgery.

UAMS RESIDENCY GOALS

- To provide care for a variety of patients including special needs and the medically compromised.
- To function effectively and efficiently in multiple health care environments within interdisciplinary health care teams in a hospital setting.
- To increase knowledge and skill beyond the predoctoral level and enhance evidence-based decision making and foster life-long learning into professional practice.
- To understand the oral health needs of communities and engage in community service.





UAMS GPR

- The UAMS GPR is a one year, hospital-based program that emphasizes providing comprehensive dental care for patients with complex medical histories. An optional second year available if an existing resident desires to pursue additional hospital and OR based dental training.
- The majority of the resident's time is spent in the UAMS
 Oral Health Clinic. A private practice environment is
 maintained throughout the program to assist you in the
 transition from academics to "real world dentistry." You will
 have your own operatory, assistant, and patient pool.
- Residents will complete several rotations through UAMS and Arkansas Children's Hospital, in addition to volunteering at the UAMS 12th Street Clinic and Harmony Health Clinic.
- Residents will receive a Post Graduate Certificate upon completion

UAMS ORAL HEALTH CLINIC PATIENT POPULATION

- Dental Clearance patients
 - Head and neck radiation therapy
 - Chemotherapy
 - Stem cell transplant/Bone marrow transplant
 - Organ transplant (liver, kidney)
 - Cardiovascular surgery
- UAMS Employees, physicians, nurses, etc.
- Patients who receive all of their medical care through the UAMS system and prefer their dental care be provided there as well.
- AR State Hospital Patients
- Patients from the community

ROTATIONS

Arkansas Children's Hospital (ACH) Pedo, OMFS, Perio (3 weeks)

- Provide comprehensive and emergency treatment to pediatric and special needs patients primarily in ACH Outpatient Surgery
- Assist and provide care alongside our faculty at ACH: 3
 orthodontists, 1 periodontist, 2 pediatric dentists, 2 general
 dentists, and 2 oral surgeons
- Common procedures (OMFS) include 3rd molar removal, LeFort osteotomies, removal of bony and soft tissue pathology, grafting for cleft lip and palate, implant placement. Common procedures (Pedo) include stainless steel crowns, pulpotomies, extractions, and full mouth rehabilitations on children and special needs patients. Common procedures (Perio) include gingivectomies, frenectomies, and periodontal procedures in conjunction with orthodontic treatment.



ROTATIONS

Anesthesiology (UAMS) – 2 weeks

- Pre-operative patient evaluation, intraoperative patient monitoring.
- Venipuncture, airway management, anesthetic induction and intubation
- Evaluation, prevention, treatment of anesthetic emergencies

Otolaryngology (UAMS) – 2 weeks

- Shadow ENT faculty and residents
- Observe and participate in outpatient surgery procedures in the ENT clinic and operating room.
- Shadow in the Head and Neck cancer clinic and observe patients undergoing multidisciplinary management for head and neck cancer
- Shadow in the facial pain clinic.



ROTATIONS

Emergency Medicine (UAMS) – 1 week

- Recognize/triage medical emergencies in the UAMS Hospital Emergency Room. UAMS is the only Level 1 Trauma center in the state.
- Work alongside an Emergency Medicine physician
- Perform history and physicals and learn common procedures and medications administered in medical emergencies



12TH STREET AND HARMONY HEALTH CLINICS

Opportunities to volunteer and give back to the community

UAMS 12th Street Health& Wellness Clinic

- UAMS interprofessional health clinic (medical exams, nutrition, pharmacy, dental hygiene, and dental) open on Wednesday evenings
- Primarily an extraction clinic



Harmony Health Clinic

- Volunteer clinic, open daily in downtown Little Rock
- Purpose is to provide dental services to underserved populations and engage in community service.

DIDACTIC LECTURE SERIES

JOURNAL CLUB/PATIENT CARE CONFERENCE ADVANCED TREATMENT PLANNING

- Journal Club and Patient Care Conference occurs every other month. Residents will alternate presenting a scientific article and patient case they're in the process of treating.
- These conferences will prepare the resident for the end of year Final Presentation.
- Advanced Treatment Planning Conference is held every other month. All residents will prepare and present a complex patient case (models, radiographs, and photos) they've encountered in clinic. Discussion regarding treatment planning and execution is facilitated by Clinical and Adjunct Faculty.







IMPLANT PLACEMENT COURSE

- Multi-lecture implant course, taught by ACH periodontist Dr. Don Callan, which includes indications and contraindications of implant placement, bone grafting, placement techniques.
- Hands on implant restoration and implant placement courses with Nobel Biocare rep Grant Wynne.
- Clinical implant placement is facilitated by clinical faculty and adjunct faculty.
- Nobel Biocare Implant Grant
 - Nobel Biocare provides funding for <u>each resident to place 10</u> <u>implants at no cost to the patient</u> (cases can be guided).
 - Patients' only cost is the implant restoration.
 - CBCT aided implant placement planning with Nobel Biocare representative




Implant Placement Course













Resident Experience Ozark Prosthodontics



- Four-day experience takes place in a private ambulatory surgery center in Northwest Arkansas
- Residents will get exposure to complex prosthetic rehabilitation of craniofacial anomalies including cleft lip and palate, ectodermal dysplasia, amelogenesis imperfecta, etc. in addition to post head/neck radiation and chemo rehabilitation and maxillofacial trauma rehabilitation
- Center uses cutting-edge technology and employs software engineers to design prosthetics and surgical guides.
- All providers are prosthodontic specialists
 employing IV sedation with CRNAs for cases,
 allowing resident to enhance their anesthesia
 experience, in addition to their prosthodontic
 experience and surgical experience. They also bill
 90% medical insurance based on the patient
 diagnosis allowing residents to see a completely
 different practice model of medical dentistry




FORMER RESIDENTS-TESTIMONIES

"Entering residency, I was sufficient in slowly treating the bread-and-butter cases that we had commonly seen in dental school. Today I am able to tell possible future employers about the confidence I have not only in treatment planning/treating more complex patients on my own, but also of the procedures I now have experience doing that goes far beyond what most dentists at my age, and in general, are doing."

"In all seriousness, how could this residency not change someone? The number of things you are exposed to: squamous cell carcinoma in the oral cavity-learning how to make someone functional again after oral cancer treatment, very complex medical histories, full mouth extractions, full arch rehabilitation, implant placement, advanced bony surgeries, the efficiency to complete quadrant dentistry, the list here could go on. These are not things you are equipped to do coming right out of dental school."
